



Prof Mosoetsa is the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the HSRC. She assumed this role on 1 February 2023. She holds a Doctorate in Sociology from the University of the Witwatersrand. Prof Mosoetsa was instrumental in establishing and setting up the National Institute for the Humanities and Social Sciences (NIHSS) in 2013 and held the position of CEO at the Institute from 2014. She is the author of several publications, including, amongst others, *Eating from one pot: dynamics of survival in poor South African households* (Wits Press) and co-editor of *Labour in the Global South: challenges and alternatives for workers* (ILO), and co-editor of *Precarious Labor in Global Perspective* (Cambridge University Press). She has worked for various organisations, including the Society, Work and Politics Institute (SWOP), and the Development Bank of Southern Africa (DBSA). Prof Mosoetsa sits on various boards and committees, inter alia, the National Minimum Wage Commission, the University of Venda Council and the Advisory Board for the Southern Centre for Inequality Studies.
